Society's milestone

The Rylstone and District Historical Society's recent Annual General Meeting held on Saturday, August 25 marked 55 years since the Society began in 1963. At that time, eight people attended a meeting with the intention of preserving the Zion Chapel in Cox Street, Rylstone. This in effect was the beginning of the Society. The first office bearers were W Staff (president), VJ Nevell (vice-president) and G McDonald (secretary/treasurer). The group were unsuccessful in saving the Zion Chapel but were able to rent the RDHS committee members Virginia Hollister, Ed Windle, Peter Monaghan, they were able to purchase the Hugh Malone. building in 1967 for \$7,000. While much of the focus

of the Historical Society has been in maintaining and

improving the Bridge View Inn, its work on protecting

and publicising other buildings of historic interest has

been invaluable. In 1984 the Society acquired the Show

Cottage from Rylstone Shire Council. Relocating it to

its present position proved a mammoth task, but it was

achieved and has now become "The Cottage" which

houses the Society's collection of domestic and rural

life from the 1860's onward. Items include costume,

rustic furniture, memorabilia and photos of pioneers

and the town and district. There is also a collection of

interesting books - some for sale including a terrific

little book called "Celebrating Fifty Years 1963 - 2013"

by Jeanette McCarthy and Pat Spithill which has

provided some of the information in this article. Over

the years, a small office space has been constructed

at the rear of the building which has become the office

of the Society as well as an area for family and district

research. They are currently completing an archive

and storage room which will be officially opened later

in the year. Overall, the ongoing legacy of the Historical

Society has been enormous, but it hasn't always been

plain sailing. The year 2003 was a watershed year

for the Society. The cost of maintaining the Bridge

View Inn and a decline in membership resulted in a

special meeting which was attended by five people. A

proposal to sell the Bridge View Inn and subdivide the

land owned by the society was passed unanimously.

The decision galvanised the community which said a

decisive NO to the sale and the Society was able to rejuvenate itself. New life was breathed back into the Society and following successful grant applications

the Bridge View Inn has been restored and preserved for future generations. It now houses a number of businesses and delightful B&B accommodation in

the upstairs area of the building. At the recent AGM,

elections were held for office bearers and committee

members. They are: Shirley Tunnicliff -President, Ed

Windle - Vice-President, Virginia Hollister - Secretary

and Peter Monaghan - Treasurer. Ordinary members



are: Hugh Malone, Allan Wills and Sue Pridmore. In an interview with Community Capers, Mrs Tunnicliff said she was very pleased that the Society was able to maintain the Bridge View Inn as a publicly accessible space.

"We still have maintenance costs and ongoing upgrades to consider of course, but we are very well placed to cover these and it gives me great pleasure to see this whole complex being used and enjoyed by the community and visitors to our district." Mrs Tunnicliff thanked all the volunteers for their great work but stressed that Bridge View Inn while negotiating its Shirley Tunniciff and Sue Pridners. and they need more volunteers for the purchase. Radio's AGM results

Kandos Rylstone Community Radio KRR 98.7 FM held its Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, August 29. Results of the elections are as follows: President Brent Barlow. Vice-President - Brian Neaves. Secretary - Karen Riley and Treasurer - Pat Spithill. Ordinary members are - Ron Spithill, Peter Hay and Scott Hogansen. A number of sub committees were also formed. During his President's Report. Brent Barlow outlined the achievements made during the year. These include solar panels installed on the roof which has cut electricity costs by half, replacement of the old terracotta sewage line with a new PVC line, along with a new mains water line, and the installation of a brick retaining wall to prevent water seepage under the western side of the building. Regular working bees have also been held to improve and update equipment. The popular monthly newsletter, Community Capers continues to be published each month by KRR and is distributed throughout the community and beyond. Brent thanked the team of inserters and folders who help get the newsletter out each month. He also congratulated the presenters for their terrific shows each week.

Kandos artist at Regional

Kandos artist, Terry Burrows' exhibition Objectivity at the Bathurst Regional Art Gallery is a substantial event and has resulted in much comment and admiration. It covers over 10 years of his significant art practice and includes a room devoted to projects completed as a result of residencies in India.

Primarily, Terry Burrows creates medium to largescale, minimal palette-paintings that work between the abstract and the figurative.

Terry's practice also encompasses drawing, photography, and video, all of which, to some degree are represented in Objectivity.

His classic work The Banaras Back Book is also featured along with some interesting comment on video via headphones for personal viewing and listening.


Saturdays and 11am to 2pm Sundays.


