## **ANZAC** Day well supported

Good crowds attended this year's ANZAC Day commemorative services in Kandos and Rylstone. Around 150 or more people payed their respects at the Kandos Dawn Service — a wonderful effort. The service was broadcast live on local radio station KRR 98.7 FM and was much appreciated by listeners across the region. In Rylstone, the Dawn Service attracted another good turnout with a large crowd attending the 6am service. Both of the 11am

The marchers received loud applause from the crowd that lined Angus Avenue.

## Radio receives grant

Kandos Rylstone Community
Radio received a very welcome
visit from Local Member for
Bathurst Paul Toole recently
when he came with cheque
in hand to deliver a grant of
\$6,400 for the station. The
money is for remedial work
to help combat some serious
water issues at their Angus
Avenue building. Mr Toole
was contacted by members
of the community station to
see if there was any support

that could be offered. In delivering the grant money Mr Toole said the station was the epitome of 'community'. "This community radio station is such a fantastic example of small town communities coming together. With over 50 members, and 30 or more presenters, they are all volunteers from the local community. After an enormous amount of fundraising, KRR purchased the building from which they operate, and have made an incredible effort in bringing it back to its former glory, providing a well-respected and loved service to the community.

"Recent water seepage from higher ground adjacent to the building has caused some minor damage to the building. Following a request for assistance, I was able to obtain \$6,400 from the NSW Government's Premier's Discretionary Fund. This will not only repair existing damage, but also prevent any further damage in the future," Mr Toole said. The funding will be used to complete excavation work as well as installing a retaining wall to prevent water seepage in the long term. Station President, Brent Barlow said they were very grateful for the assistance.

## **New Waste Collection**

Food and Garden Waste Collection begins on July 1. Residents will also receive an education pack with their new bin explaining how to use the new service. Waste collection days will change for most residents following the introduction of the Food and Garden Waste Organics Collection. For residents in Kandos, Rylstone, Rathdowney, Charbon and Clandulla the collection day will change to Friday after July1.

## Lue School recycles for cash

Several students at Lue Public School are working together to raise funds towards a school excursion by using the 'return and earn' program of recycling. Students are collecting plastic bottles which are then counted, bagged and taken to Foodworks in Rylstone (collection point) and redeemed for cash. The students have been given a challenge to raise \$500 by the end of Term 2. By the end of Term 1 they had raised around \$300 or so and are well on their way to achieving their goal.

In addition to the obvious mathematical learning (tallying, graphing data, addition and money skills), students have been learning about the recycling process and the impact waste plastic has on our environment. Their sense of pride at being able to contribute to their own excursion is spurring them on and School Principal Caron McDonald said she is very proud of their determination.

"A big thank you must go to the parents and community members who are dropping off the bottles to school and to the staff at Rylstone Foodworks who have been so very supportive of our challenge. I think we have some future entrepreneurs in the making at Lue," she said.

## Great FTG result




